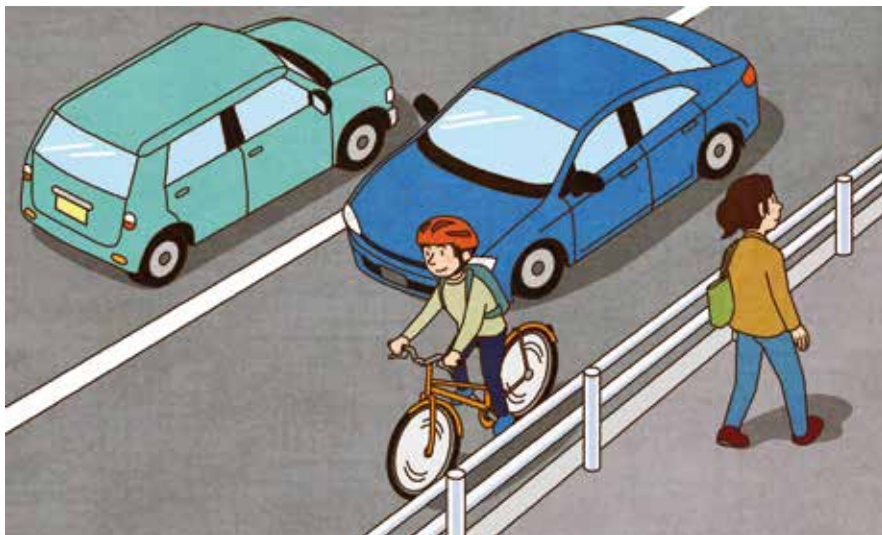

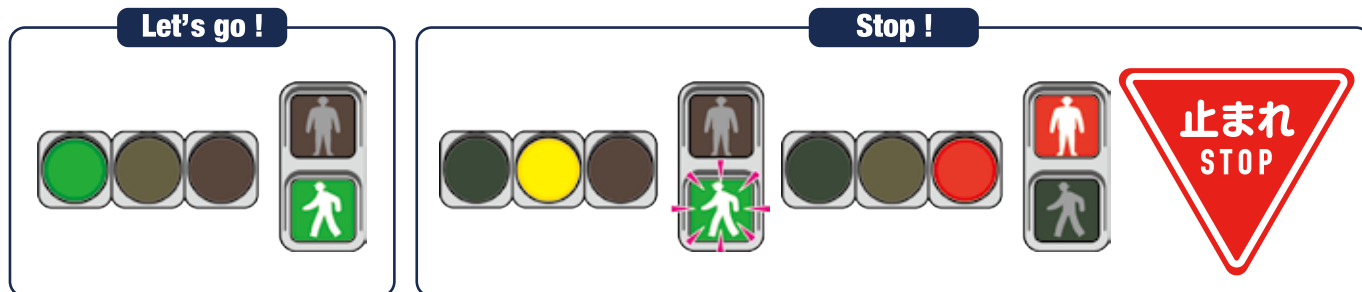
# Japanese Traffic Rules & Manners

### Pedestrians on the right. Cars and bicycles on the left.



- Cars and bicycles run on the left side of the road.
- Pedestrians walk on the right side of the road.
- Pedestrians use sidewalks or pedestrian zones if they are available.

### Obey traffic lights and road signs.



### What to do in the event of a traffic accident.



③ Dial "119" and Dial "110"



- ① Stop your bike immediately.
- ② Move your bike to the roadside. Do not block traffic.
- ③ Call an ambulance (dial 119) if someone is injured. Give emergency aid until the ambulance arrives. However, do not try to move the injured person. Call the police (dial 110). Never leave the scene of an accident. You are obliged to explain to the police how the accident happened.

# Let's review traffic rules & manners for bicycles

## As a general rule, bicycles travel on the road.

(Bicycles on sidewalks are allowed only as exceptions to the rule)

Violation may be subject to: imprisonment of up to 3 months or fine of up to 50,000 yen.

~Cases where bicycles are allowed on sidewalks~

**1** Where designated by road signs or road markings

"Pedestrian and Bicycle Only" road sign



**2** If the cyclist is:

- A child under 13 years-old
- A person at least 70 years old
- A person with a physical disability



## Travel on the left side of the road

Violation may be subject to: imprisonment of up to 3 months or fine of up to 50,000 yen.

**3** When otherwise unavoidable to ensure your own safety



## Pedestrians have the right of way on sidewalks Ride slowly, staying on the side close to the roadway

On the sidewalk, proceed at a speed that can allow you to stop immediately. Stop whenever there is a possibility of blocking pedestrian passage.

Violations may be subject to: fine of up to 20,000 yen or a minor fine

## Obey the safety rules

### Drunk riding

Penalty: Imprisonment of up to 5 years or fine of up to 1,000,000 yen

### Riding with a passenger



**X**  
Penalty: Fine of up to 20,000 yen or minor fine

### Riding side by side



**X**  
Penalty: Fine of up to 20,000 yen or minor fine

### Riding at night without a light



**X**  
Penalty: Fine of up to 50,000 yen

### Ignoring traffic lights



**X**  
Penalty: Imprisonment of up to 3 months or fine of up to 50,000 yen

### Failing to stop



**X**  
Penalty: Imprisonment of up to 3 months or fine of up to 50,000 yen

### Using a mobile phone while riding



**X**  
Penalty: Fine of up to 50,000 yen

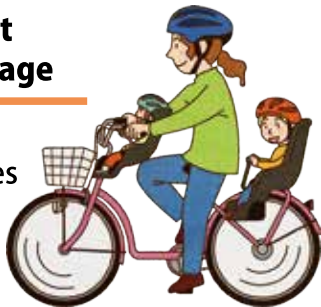
### Using an umbrella while riding



**X**  
Penalty: Fine of up to 50,000 yen

## Wear a helmet regardless of age

About 70% of cycling fatalities are from head injuries.



## Take out insurance in case of a bicycle accident

The Tokyo Metropolitan Government ordinance has been amended, making it mandatory from April 1, 2020 for all those who use bicycles to be insured\*.

Take out insurance to cover yourself in case of a bicycle accident.

\* Accident insurance for liability coverage in the event of death or bodily injury to a third party caused when using a bicycle
